

Feature Summary

Manage Microsoft Windows, Active Directory, Exchange, Exchange 2007, IIS, SQL Server, DHCP, DNS, Cluster Server, System Center Operation Manager, and System Center Mobile Device Manager, RSA, Lotus Domino, Novell, Oracle, BlackBerry Enterprise Server, BlackBerry Enterprise Server 5, Citrix, HP iLO, Backup Exec and VMware Virtual Infrastructure servers, Nagios, BMC Remedy Service Desk, BMC Performance Manager Portal, Microsoft Hyper-V and create SSH/Telnet and RDP/VNC connections from your wireless handheld device or any computer.

Security Features

Data encryption options include TDES or AES on the BlackBerry network, and VPN or HTTPS encryption by default.

Authentication options include Windows username and password, Mobile Admin-specific username and password, device-level password and RSA SecurID / RADIUS authentication.

Telnet/SSH Features

Use Telnet, SSH1, SSH2 and VT100 to connect to a wide range of network devices including Unix and Linux servers, Cisco routers and switches, and Novell Netware servers.

- Telnet – access to any network device or server
- SSH1 and SSH2 – for secure access
- SSH2 public key authentication – for enhanced security
- VT100 terminal emulation – run any Unix or Linux program such as Pine, VI, Emacs or Top

- Novell support – Telnet to Netware servers to control the Console, send commands and run programs such as inetcfg and monitor

AS/400 and iSeries Features (BlackBerry client only)

Use IBM 5250 terminal emulation to connect to your AS/400 and iSeries servers:

- IBM 5250 terminal access using TN5250
- Support for 5250 special keys
- Access AS/400 and iSeries applications
- User-definable macro keys

IBM Mainframe Features (BlackBerry client only)

Use IBM 3270 terminal emulation to manage to your IBM mainframes from your wireless handheld.

- IBM 3270 terminal emulation
- Support for 3270 special keys
- User-definable macro keys

RDP / VNC Features

Use your wireless handheld to view the screen and even control the keyboard or mouse of your remote computers. Create connections to almost any operating system, including Windows, Mac OS X, Linux, Solaris, QNX and OS/2.

Remote Desktop Protocol (RDP) is a communications protocol that allows you to connect securely to any computer that is running Microsoft Terminal Services or Remote Desktop. Mobile Admin uses RDP to act as a Terminal Services or Remote Desktop client on your wireless handheld, to process keyboard and mouse data from

the remote computer.

VNC is a client-server protocol. A VNC client connects to a VNC server to receive screen updates and to process keyboard and mouse movements. For VNC connections, Mobile Admin acts as a VNC client on your wireless handheld. You must install a VNC server on the computer you want to access.
